Science: Extreme Environments

Focus:

In Term 1, students explore animals in extreme environments and the adaptations they develop to survive. Students identify human impacts on environments and how these affect individual species. Students explore conservation efforts and make predictions based on current events.

Students will:

- Describe and predict the effect of environmental changes on individual living things
- Explain how scientific knowledge helps us to solve problems and inform decisions
- Communicate ideas, explanations and processes

HASS: Life Above and Below the Poverty Line

Focus:

This term, students will explore communities above and below the poverty line and provide a practical solution to issues in a community

Students will:

- Interpret data to infer relationships and evaluate evidence to draw conclusions
- Describe, compare and explain the diverse characteristics of different places
- Describe the cause and effect of change on society
- Describe how people, places, communities and environments are diverse and globally interconnected
- Develop appropriate questions to frame an investigation
- Sequence information about

events, the lives of individuals and selected phenomena

- Locate and collect useful data and information from primary and secondary sources
- Organise and represent data in a range of formats
- Present ideas, findings, viewpoints and conclusions in a range of communication forms that incorporate source materials

Design Technologies

In Term 1, students will design a kitchen garden that is sustainable.

Students will:

- Create design for a garden suitable for identified needs or opportunities
- Suggest criteria for success, including sustainability considerations, and uses these to evaluate their ideas and designed solutions
- Records project plans including production processes



Health and Physical Education

Focus:

In Health, students will investigate how physical activity creates opportunities for different groups to work together. They will identify how physical activity contributes to individual and community wellbeing. Students will collect information on physical activity participation in their school setting and explore how technology can support participation in physical activity.

In Physical Education (P.E) students will develop the fundamental skills of soccer through active participation in activities, games and movement challenges.

The Arts

Focus:

This Semester, students will be exploring Visual Arts and Music in their Arts lessons. In Visual Arts, students will explain how ideas are represented in artworks they make and view. They describe the influences of artworks and practices from different cultures, times and places on their art making. Students use visual conventions and visual arts practices to express a personal view in their artworks. They demonstrate different techniques and processes in planning and making artworks. They describe how the display of artworks enhances meaning for an audience.

In Music, students will make and respond to music exploring the music-making of other cultures through their music journal. They will perform, compose and respond to music from other cultures.

Focus:

This Semester, students will to explore the concept of school life in Japan and make connections with own school experiences.
