English: Examining and creating narratives

Focus:

This term, students will examine literary texts to gain an understanding of the feelings and circumstances of characters. They will write a short story about a character that faces a conflict and reflect on the writing process when making and explaining editorial choices.

Students will:

- Understand how language features and language patterns can be used for emphasis
- Create detailed texts elaborating on key ideas
- Demonstrate understanding of grammar and make considered vocabulary choices to enhance cohesion and structure of their writing
- Use accurate spelling and punctuation for clarity and make and explain editorial choices based on criteria

Mathematics

Focus:

In Term 3, students will focus on a applying a variety of mathematical concepts in real-life, lifelike and purely mathematical situations.

Students will:

- use mathematical modelling to solve financial and other practical problems involving percentages and rational numbers, formulating and solving the problem, and justifying choices
- add and subtract fractions with related denominators
- use all 4 operations with decimals and connect decimal representations of measurements to the metric system
- convert between common units of length, mass and capacity
- They use the formula for the area of a rectangle and angle properties to solve problems

Science: Natural Disasters

Focus:

In Term 3, students explore how sudden geological changes and extreme weather events can affect Earth's surface. They consider the effects of earthquakes and volcanoes on Earth's surface and how communities are affected by these events.

Students will:

- Explain how natural events cause rapid change to Earth's surface
- Identify historical and cultural contributions
- Collect, organise and interpret data identifying where research could improve the data
- Communicate ideas and findings

- Identify variables to be changed and measured and describe potential safety risks when planning methods
- Follow procedures to develop investigable questions and design investigations into simple cause-and-effect relationships
- Describe and analyse relationships in data using appropriate representations

HASS: Civics and Citizenship

Focus:

This term, Year 6 students will explore the three levels of government and how citizenship rights have changed for different groups.

Students will:

- Identify and describe continuities and changes for different groups in the past and present
- Compare the experiences of different people in the past
- Explain the importance of people, institutions and processes to Australia's democracy and legal system
- Describe the rights and responsibilities of Australian citizens and the obligations they may have as global citizens

how to respond to an issue or challenge

- Examine sources to determine their origin and purpose and to identify different perspectives in the past and present
- Collaboratively generate alternative responses to an issue, use criteria to make decisions and identify the advantages and disadvantages of preferring one decision over the other
- Present ideas, findings, viewpoints and conclusions in a range of communication forms that incorporate source materials

Focus:

In Term 3, students will investigate digital systems and how they are interconnected. They will design and code a game with user-interface and develop their understanding of binary and the role it places in running computers.

Health & P.E

In Health, students will gain an understanding of multiculturalism by examining the changing nature of Australia's cultural identity through exploring the influence of people and places. They examine how sharing traditional foods and physical activities from different cultures can support community wellbeing and cultural understanding.

In P.E, students will will develop and perform the specialised movement skills of passing, kicking and catching in 'All codes' football game situations. They will propose and combine movement concepts and strategies to achieve outcomes in 'All codes' football.

The Arts: Music & Media Arts

Focus:

This Semester, students will be exploring Media Arts and Music in their Arts lessons. In Media Arts, students will explore music video styling, concepts and production processes from ideation to creation. They will explore the purpose of music videos and work collaboratively to create a music video

<u>In Music</u>, students will make and respond to music by exploring the concept of ostinato - a rhythmic or melodic pattern that is repeated throughout a section or a whole piece of music. They will perform, compose and respond to music featuring rhythmic ostinatos.
