# English: Exploring Persuasive Texts

#### Focus:

This term, students will listen to, read and view a range of texts designed to persuade.

#### Students will:

- Describe how events and settings in texts are depicted and explain their own responses to them
- Uses language features to show how ideas can be extended
- Develop and explain a point of view, selection information and ideas from a range of sources
- Creates persuasive texts for purposes and audiences
- Use a variety of sentence types

- Select specific vocabulary
- Make presentations which include multimodal elements for defined purposes.
- They contribute actively to class and group discussions, taking into account other perspectives
- Listen and ask questions to clarify content

# **Mathematics**

#### Focus:

In Term 2, students will focus on a applying a variety of mathematical concepts in real-life, lifelike and purely mathematical situations.

#### Students will:

- express natural numbers as products of factors and identify multiples
- use their proficiency with multiplication facts and efficient calculation strategies to multiply large numbers by oneand two-digit numbers and divide by single-digit numbers
- check the reasonableness of their calculations using estimation

- use mathematical modelling to solve financial and other practical problems, formulating and solving problems, choosing arithmetic operations and interpreting results in terms of the situation
- apply properties of numbers and operations to find unknown values in numerical equations involving multiplication and division
- create and use algorithms to identify and explain patterns in the factors and multiples of numbers
- convert between 12- and 24-hour time

# Science: Matter Matters

#### Focus:

In Term 2, students will broaden their classification of matter to include gases and begin to see how matter structures the world around them. They will understand that solids, liquids and gases have some shared and some distinct observable properties and can behave in different ways.

#### Students will:

- Classify substances according to their observable properties and behaviours
- Pose a question for investigation and predict the effect of changing variables when planning an investigation

- Use equipment in ways that are safe and improve the accuracy of their observations
- Construct tables and graphs to organise data and identify patterns in the data
- Compare patterns in their data with predictions when suggesting explanations
- Describe ways to improve the fairness of their investigation
- Communicate their ideas and findings using multimodal texts

# HASS: Consumer Decision-Making

Focus: This semester, Year 5 investigate how people in communities make decisions about the use of resources to meet their needs and wants

#### Students will:

- Examine how to distinguish between needs and wants
- Identify why choices need to be made about how limited resources are used
- Investigate how different types of resources are used by societies to satisfy needs and wants of present and future generations
- describe a variety of factors influence consumer choices
- identify and present findings about different strategies that can be used to help make

informed personal consumer and financial choices.

# Design and Technologies

#### Focus:

In Term 2, students will investigate design as additional garden space in our school environment so that students can grow nutritious food.

Students will:

- Develop an understanding of the design process
- Determine how materials can be manipulated for design purposes
- Describe how co-existence with wildlife occurs in a range of settings
- Identify and explain how competing factors impact the process of design
- Explore authentic settings within and beyond the school setting to evaluate the relationship between design and wildlife
- Design, draw and annotate a wildlife support solution
- Develop a criteria for success and evaluate a project
- Identify potential safety risks and develop safety strategies

#### Focus:

In Health, students will investigate the influence of

emotions on behaviours and discuss factors that influence how people interact. They will explore their own and others' contributions to health, safety and wellbeing, and continue to develop skills to work collaboratively.

including running, jumping, landing, balancing and safety rolls. They will explore how to combine free running skills, movement concepts and strategies to com-

# The Arts: Music & Visual Arts

#### Focus:

This Semester, students will be exploring Visual Arts and Music in their Arts lessons. In Visual Arts. students will explain how ideas are represented in artworks they make and view. They describe the influences of artworks and practices from different cultures, times and places on their art making. Students use visual conventions and visual arts practices to express a personal view in their artworks. They demonstrate different techniques and processes in planning and making artworks. They describe how the display of artworks enhances meaning for an audience.

In Music, students will make and respond to music exploring the music-making of other cultures through their music journal. They will perform, compose and respond to music from other cultures.
